

Ideas for Show and Tell

- **Pets** (pictures, soft toy or something belonging to their pet) can be good subjects for **Show and Tell**.
 - If a child learns about certain **animals at the animal park/ bird park/ petting farm**, s/he may take **photos** to show to his class.
 - Something as simple as a **favourite book** can make a good subject.
 - A **favourite toy** can be used in a **Show and Tell** session.
 - A **present/ card** given by a special member of the family or friend can be a good idea.
 - A child's **artwork** may be shared during **Show and Tell**.
 - A **model/something the child worked on** at home – maybe during Christmas, the crib, during Carnival – a carnival float/mask/puppet etc.
 - Many children enjoy sharing a particular **holiday abroad** or **family outing memories**.
 - A child may want to speak about a family member/s or friend/s and show a **photo** or some **photos**.
 - **Step by step photos/video** of an **activity** s/he has done at home (which will serve as prompts). Examples may include, building blocks, doing jigsaw puzzles, a science experiment, painting a picture, mixing ingredients while cooking.
 - A child may decide to speak about his **favourite hobby** – sports, martial arts, camping, scouts, music etc.
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
